Katrina Majkut is a local artist who is creating pinwheels out of used two-liter soda bottles to bring awareness to alternative energy sources and how they can be art. This large-scale art installation is called *Art on the Wind* and can be seen at Brookline's Larz Anderson Park during the month of August. "My goal is to create a work of art that the entire city can enjoy," Majkut says, "which also educates about the need for, and beauty of, alternative energy. Windmills and solar panels don't have to be scars on the landscape; they can become functional works of art if people start thinking more creatively." You radical types can put your pens down; these handsome pinwheels will not end up in a landfill at the end of the installation. Majkut is already looking for other parks to display her pinwheels and hopes to one day rig the pinwheels to their own wind-powered light source for a night display. Even more adorable, most of the pinwheels were made by Girl Scouts.
